Not so much a rebuttal – more a 'shot across the bow'

Halo Gravity Traction and Casting / Traction techniques have a vital place in the management of stiff EOS curves



Traction Rebuttal

- Compliance / Tolerance problems (child ability to co-operate)
- Complicated apparatus (day / night)
- Prolonged hospital stay ?
- Skull fixation (osteopenia / multiple fixation)
- Pelvic fixation (Visceral injuries described)
- Cervical spine difficulties (pain can limit ability to obtain correction)
- Neurological complications (rare but can be permanent) Emans et al SRS Edinburgh 2007

Casting Rebuttal

- Tolerance for serial casts CHILD Teenager
- Decreasing return with repeated casts
- Difficult to cast syndromic (ie PWS) or malnourished patients
- Cast syndrome
- Skin pressure / soiling issues
- Respiratory problems (marginal PFT's)
- Feeding difficulties (PEG)
- Little evidence that serial casting modifies
 the disease Goldberg et al Spine 2003 Oct 15; 28(20): 2397 406
